Real Relationships

Students meet regularly with staff who know them by name — an on-site counselor, Parent Liaison, and Transition Specialist all help students stay on track.

CTE pathways in Welding and Hospital Medical Careers — taught alongside Butte College partnerships and real career planning.

Support For Every Student

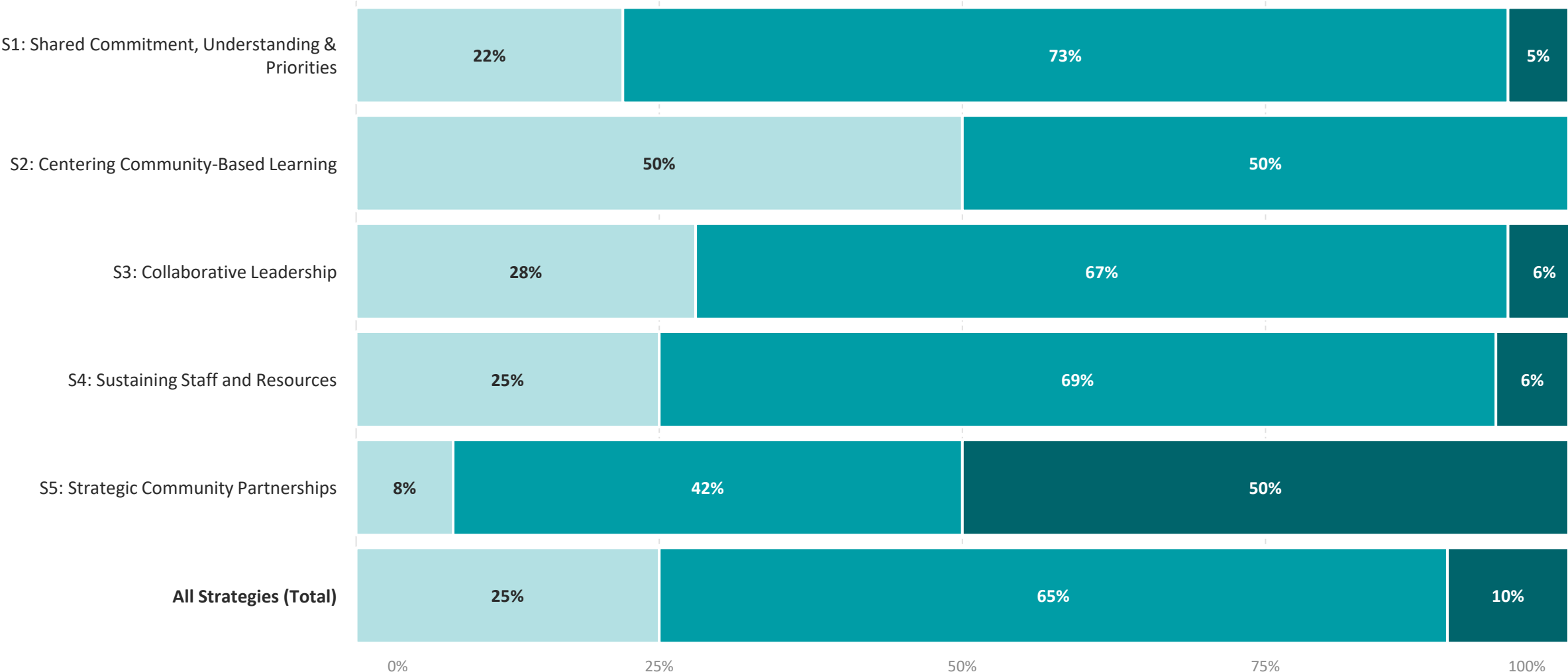
Every student works toward a personalized path to a diploma or HiSET, backed by gas cards, technology access, and steady one-on-one support.

Our Partners: Butte College, the Alliance for Workforce Development, Catalyst, the African American Family & Cultural Center, 530 Food Rescue, Soles for Souls, and Butte County Dept of Health all work alongside us to support our students and families.

How Our Work Is Growing

We're implementing five strategies behind our Community School work. Some are already a strong part of how we run things every day — others are still taking shape. Students, families, staff, and community partners' voices help guide this work!

Committed to Every Student's Success

Building real relationships and personalized support so every student has a clear path forward.

Partnerships That Support Our Students

Working alongside community partners to meet everyday needs so nothing stands in the way of finishing school.

Learning Connected to Real Life

Connecting coursework to hands-on skills and career paths that lead somewhere real.

What We're Doing — And What's Next

Getting Students to Graduation

What's working: Our Transition Specialist helps students secure the documents they need — IDs, licenses, birth certificates — while personalized graduation-option meetings walk every student through their path to a diploma or HiSET. Our One-Year Graduation Rate has grown from 51.5% to 84.9%.

What's next: We're deepening support for students pursuing college readiness alongside HiSET success, working closely with our Transition Specialist to bridge that gap.

Learning That Fits

What's working: Reading scores are up 39% and math scores are up 36% since Fall (Local Assessment). Students are gaining real-world skills through CTE welding training, career exploration, and Butte College partnerships.

What's next: We're expanding CTE offerings toward the strong student interest we're seeing in Medical Nursing and other career pathways.

Support Beyond the Classroom

What's working: An on-site counselor, a Parent Liaison, and gas cards for transportation all help remove barriers to showing up and staying engaged. Monthly Come Back Connection events bring in community partners like Butte College and Catalyst.

What's next: We're growing participation in these events and deepening our community partnerships so more students benefit from them.

A Calmer, More Focused Campus

What's working: 100% of students say staff help them reach their goals, and students describe feeling respected and known by name (LCAP Survey).

What's next: We're building more support around organization, time management, and stress management — the areas students themselves identified as their biggest challenges.
