EXAMINATIONS ARE GIVEN IN ENGLISH AND SPANISH.

STUDENTS MAY SIGN UP ONLINE TO TAKE ONE OR MORE OF THE FOUR GED EXAMINATIONS: LANGUAGE ARTS, MATHEMATICAL REASONING, SOCIAL STUDIES AND SCIENCE.

STUDENTS CAN PREPARE FOR THE GED EXAMS BY ENROLLING IN GED CLASSES AT WATSONVILLE/ APTOS/SANTA CRUZ ADULT EDUCATION.

**PROGRAMS:** Watsonville/Aptos/Santa Cruz Adult Education offers instructional programs in English and Spanish to assist students in completing their secondary education. The programs are:

- **HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA** (English only) fully accredited (A-G) program for students wishing to complete a high school diploma. Classes offered include: English, Health, Social Studies, Math, Science and Visual Arts.

- **HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY (HSE)** (English or Spanish) Preparation program for students studying for the GED and the HiSET equivalency test.

- **TRANSITIONS...PATHWAYS TO EMPLOYMENT OR COLLEGE** (English ONLY) offered to students near completion of their GED/HiSET or HSD who are ready to transition to college or a specific career technical skill based program.

- **CREDIT RECOVERY** (English ONLY), a program designed for high school students to make up credits.

- **WORKKEYS CURRICULUM** (English ONLY), a program designed to teach students what they need to know to pass the WorkKeys exam. The WorkKeys exam is offered at the Green Valley Center and Santa Cruz Center, see page 13.

An individualized course of study based on assessment, schedule, and goals will be designed for each student, enabling learners to earn their high school diploma or pass the GED/HiSET exams while improving their skills for college or career training. Courses are offered in teacher-directed classrooms aligned with the Common Core State Standards (CCSS).

**PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS:** All students (except credit recovery) must meet the following criteria to enroll in classes and maintain ongoing enrollment:

- Complete assessments and attend one to one counseling appointment before beginning class.
- Maintain attendance:
  - **MORNING CLASSES** 9 hours per week minimum attendance with demonstrated progress
  - **EVENING CLASSES** 6 hours per week minimum attendance with demonstrated progress
- Sign and adhere to our School Code of Conduct and Internet Use Policies

CITIZENSHIP INFORMATION

Students can qualify to participate if they have been permanent residents of the United States for 5 or more years or have been married to a U.S. Citizen for at least 3 years. Applicants for U.S. citizenship who are 50 years of age or older and have been lawful permanent residents for 20 years, or who are 55 years of age or older and have been permanent residents for 15 years, are exempt from the English examination and may take the examination in their native language at the Office of Immigration and Naturalization. Citizenship application assistance is available in class. Citizenship and Citizenship/ESL classes are offered at different times and days.

INFORMACIÓN DE CIUDADANÍA

Los estudiantes pueden calificar para participar si han sido residentes permanentes de los Estados Unidos por lo menos 5 años o 3 años si están casados con un ciudadano de los Estados Unidos. Integrated English Literacy and Civics Education (IELCE) refers to contextualized English as a Second Language (ESL) or Basic Skills classes that prepare English language learners to succeed in a specific career technical class (CTE). Career Technical Education classes are available for all students. IELCE classes are specialized ESL classes to help prepare language learners for eligibility to enroll in CTE courses. 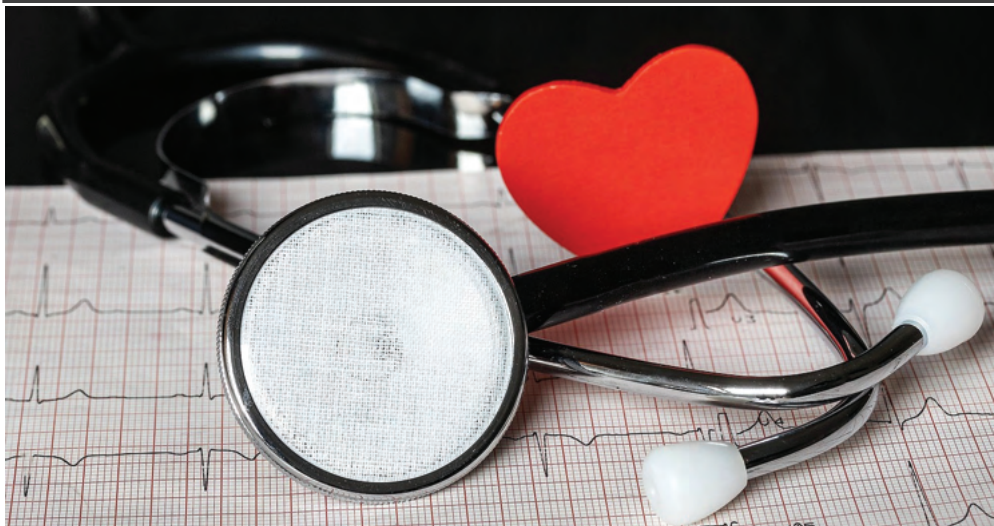

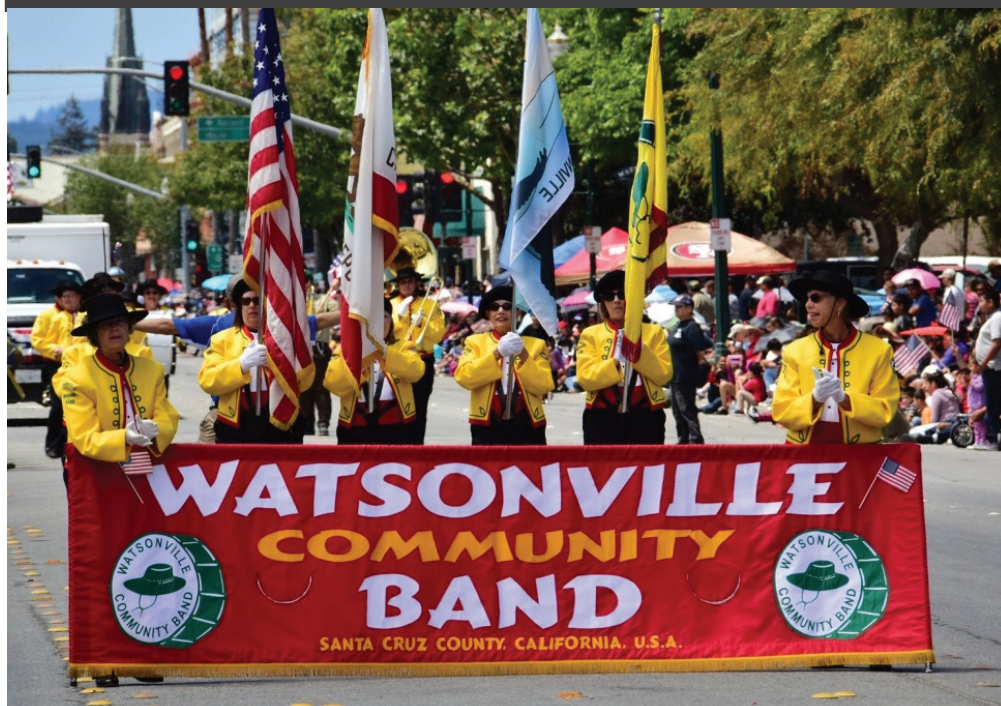

Established in 1928 as an "Evening High School," our school has a rich history of adapting to the needs of our diverse and dynamic community. ## REFUND POLICY

## UNIFORM COMPLAINT PROCEDURE

The Governing board recognizes that the district is responsible for ensuring that it complies with state and federal laws and regulations governing educational programs. The District shall follow uniform complaint procedures when addressing complaints alleging unlawful discrimination based on ethnic group identification, religion, age, gender, color, or physical or mental disability in any program or activity that receives or benefits from state financial assistance. The district shall also follow uniform complaint procedures when addressing complaints alleging failure to comply with state or federal law in adult basic education, consolidated categorical aid programs, migrant education, vocational education, child care and development programs, child nutrition programs and special education programs. (Title 5, Section 4621)

The Board encourages the early, informal resolution of complaints at the site level whenever possible. Upon receipt of a written complaint from an individual, public agency or organization, uniform complaint procedures shall be initiated. The Superintendent or designee shall distribute full information about these procedures. The Board recognizes that a neutral mediator can often suggest an early compromise that is agreeable to all parties in a dispute. In accordance with uniform complaint procedures, whenever all parties to a complaint agree to try resolving their problem through mediation, the Superintendent or designee shall initiate a mediation process before beginning a formal compliance investigation. The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that mediation results are consistent with state and federal laws and regulations. (Title 5, Section 4631).

The Board acknowledges and respects student and employee rights to privacy. Discrimination complaints shall be investigated in a manner that protects the confidentiality of the parties and the facts. This includes keeping the identity of the complainant confidential except to the extent necessary to carry out the investigation or proceedings, as determined by the Superintendent or designee on a case-by-case basis. (Title 5, Section 4621). The Board prohibits retaliation in any form for the filing of a complaint, the reporting of instances of discrimination or participation in complaint procedures. Such participation shall not in any way affect the status, grades or word assignments of the complainant.
