Program Details:

- Earn your teaching credential in one year - Multiple Subject, Single Subject, Mild to Moderate Support Needs, Extensive Support Needs credential, or a dual credential
- Dual credentials are available for Multiple Subject & Mild to Moderate Support Needs or Single Subject & Mild to Moderate Support Needs
- Attend coursework online two days a week through Teachers College of San Joaquin
- 9-12 units count towards a Master's Degree in Education from Teachers College San Joaquin

Cost & Stipend:

- Tuition: Approximately \$12,000 - \$13,000
- Interest-free payment plan options & grant opportunities are available
- Residents will be given a \$38,000 cost of living stipend

Eligibility Requirements:

- Possess a Bachelor's Degree (or higher) from a regionally accredited institution
- Meet Basic Skills Requirement (e.g. passage of courses in reading, writing, and math)
- Meet US Constitution Requirement
- Evidence of working towards completing Subject Matter Competence, e.g. CSET (by December 2026)
